# WATERFRONT LIFESTYLE

Fort Pierce offers a family-friendly, small-town lifestyle complete with tree-lined neighborhoods, miles of undeveloped beaches and waterfront neighborhoods.

### HISTORIC FORT PIERCE

Come enjoy Fort Pierce's historic, vibrant business districts filled with specialty boutiques, unique dining experiences and arts and entertainment in a culturally diverse, friendly and inviting environment.

Stroll through historic downtown Fort Pierce and take in the natural beauty and the historic architecture. Check out the many shops, restaurants and attractions as you feel the breeze coming in off of the Indian River.

Catch a show at the historic Sunrise Theatre, a major performing arts theatre for the region, which was built in 1923 and extensively renovated. Inside you'll find a full size stage, balcony and orchestra pit. Depending on when you're in town, you can catch such acts such as Hairspray and Bill Cosby.

### MARINAS AND MUSEUMS

At the Fort Pierce City Marina, you can dock your boat or book a fishing charter to hook your next big catch. Then you

can visit the Pelican's Nest Gift Shop at the marina – just be sure to pick up some fish food for all the hungry catfish that await just outside the door. Lean over the railing and watch as the fish magically appear to gobble up their treats.

Practically next door you'll find the Manatee Education and Observation Center, the historic Seven Gables House, and the A.E. Backus Gallery & Museum where you'll find original works from the famed Florida landscape artist and Fort Pierce native A.E. "Bean" Backus, Highwaymen paintings and offerings from contemporary local artists.

### GOLFING

Great golfing waits for you a few miles down the road at the Edward G. Enns Indian Hills Golf Course. The 6555-yard newly designed course is a favorite of newcomers and long-time residents alike. This challenging yet user-friendly new course features wide fairways, expansive tee surfaces, greens and continuous concrete cart paths. Seventy-two sand bunkers located throughout the course add to the challenge for your approaches and tee shots. You'll also find a 320-yard practice range and a short-game practice green.





### UNSPOILED BEACHES

On Hutchinson Island you'll find white powder sands on our unspoiled Atlantic Ocean beaches, as well as the St. Lucie County Regional History Center, the Smithsonian Marine Ecosystems Exhibit and the National Navy UDT/SEAL Museum.

In addition to our array of attractions, Fort Pierce is host to numerous festivals as well as open air concerts in its amphitheater.

### CULTURE AND ARTS

Join us the first Friday of every month for Friday Fest – a street party with live entertainment, food and drink in the historic waterfront downtown. On the second Wednesday of each month, check out our local art galleries while enjoying music and food at the Downtown ArtWalk. Shop for fresh, locally grown produce, bakery items, citrus and more every Saturday morning along the waterfront at the Farmers' Market.
